5. Reclassification for English Learners:
  - The purpose was to review the District's Reclassification procedures

- Reclassification means: when an English Learner no longer needs English language support. That student then is known as an R-FEP (Reclassified-Fluent English Proficient).
  - 2020-2021: December grades 3-6 470 students reclassified
  - After Reclassification your child will no longer take the ELPAC (English Language Proficiency Assessments for California). Teachers monitor your child's progress for 4 years to see if support is needed.
  - Reclassification Criteria:
    - ✓ English Language Proficiency
    - ✓ Academic Achievement
    - ✓ Teacher evaluation
    - ✓ Parent/Guardian opinion and consultation.
  - Reclassification of Students with Disabilities:
    - ✓ Alternative reclassification process
    - ✓ IEP team
    - ✓ Parent input
    - ✓ Oral language assessment and Work samples.
    - ✓ 4 years monitoring
6. English Language Proficiency Assessments of California (ELPAC) information was given on how this assessment is given to identify students who need support learning academic English (Initial ELPAC). And longer assessment where the goal is to measure annual progress towards learning academic English, and provides information about whether a student has met goals for reclassification. (Summative ELPAC)
