



ELAC Minutes January 19th 2021

1. CALL TO ORDER: ELAC chairperson Yadira Herrera called the meeting to order at 11:05 and welcomed everyone to the meeting. Reminded to please follow our School blog for important information and updates.
2. ROLL CALL: quorum was not established.
3. APPROVAL OF AGENDA: quorum not established.
4. APPROVAL OF MINUTES: quorum not established.
5. DELAC REPORT: report given by DELAC representative Yadira Herrera. Superintendent Dr. Escobedo talked about vaccination to school staff being prepared. Hybrid model being planned and a survey will be sent to parents to decide if they want this model or continue with Distance Learning. LCAP three year report needs to be planned and would like to get input from parents. Presentation of Reclassification was presented with ELCAP dates given from February 16th to March 26th. The Calendar of Events was shared by Parent engagement Liaison Angelica Maldonado and will be posted on ELAC 'S blog.
6. Mr. Shy talked about Understanding CAASPP (California Assessment of Student Performance and Progress).

The system is divided in three:

- a. Science assessments.
- b. English Language Arts/Literacy (ELA) and Mathematics summative assessments.
- c. Spanish reading/language Arts. (Wolf canyon does not take this assessment because we are not Dual Immersion).

Additional resources also available.

- WHY take CAASPP?
 - To provide teachers, students and parents with information about how students are doing in school.
 - For state information of quality education.
 - Criteria needed for English Learners to reclassify.
- WHAT:
 - Smarter Balanced Summative Assessments in ELA and Mathematics (Taken by Grades 3-8th and High School).
 - California Science Test (CAST) (Taken by 5th, 8th and High School).

- HOW:
 - On the computer.
 - Adjusts difficulty.
 - Varied question types (multiple choice/ read and respond/drag and drop/ constructed response (grade 6) /Performance task.
- WHEN: April 19 – June 11 Wolf Canyon schedule will come out at the start of the 4th quarter. Testing takes 2 days for Language arts and 2 to 3 days for Mathematics.

Mr. Shy also encouraged to learn how to interpret the CAASPP scores by visiting the official website www.cde.ca.gov (available in 7 languages). And recommended to ask your child's teacher during conferences:

- In what areas is my child doing well?
- In what areas might my child need some extra support?
- How can I help support my child at home?
- How are you supporting my child at school?

Help your Child Succeed:

- Discuss the test with your child.
- Set expectations.
- Take a practice or training test with your child.
- Make sure your child gets a good night's sleep and a nutritious breakfast before testing.

Mr. Shy went step by step thru the Online Practice and training test portal. Last school year CAASPP was cancelled due to pandemic.

Reopening will be 2 weeks after San Diego county goes back to red Tier. Depending on the results of this survey the plan of Hybrid model will be planned. If you don't answer the survey it will be understood that your child will not come back to school but stay in Distance learning mode. The probability of being in a combination class will be more in the distance learning model.
